
# Family and Comunity Nurse in Primary Health Care: Providing Essential Healthcare Services



RD 450/2005 of April 22, the specialty of Family and Community Nursing (EFyC) was established

2007 the access process through the exceptional route began 2010 its training program was approved.

In 2012, the first EFyC promotion began via EIR.

- the specialty of EFyC, all regulated. Completion of the process of access to the specialty via exceptional in 2023 with a total of 13,000 EFyC through this route and more than 4,000 via EIR
